

LBPVB Proposal for Fall Marketing Plan 2013

Overview:

This is a strategic multi-media campaign designed to use lodging taxes in a responsible, sustainable manner by targeting not just the general population, but people that are actual *potential visitors*. All consumers reached through this campaign are either: A) traveling in Washington State and/or, B) live far enough away to require lodging, **and** have enough expendable income to do so.

This campaign is for the fall or shoulder season, as that is when our community has the room and need for tourism growth and the positive impact of the campaign will be more easily identified.

The sustainability goal for LBPVB for all lodging tax funds spent on marketing is 300 visitors for every \$1000 spent. Any project that does not have the potential for this return is a drain on the lodging tax funds. Simply put, lodging taxes need to generate more lodging taxes. All of the components included in this proposal are capable of and are likely to far exceed this return ratio. Therefore the entire campaign is a highly sustainable and responsible use of lodging tax funds.

Time frame:

Sept 2013 through Feb 2014, with production to start immediately.

Location:

This campaign reflects the origins and source of our detailed visitor tracking.

33% of our visitors are from Seattle - Tacoma area.

14% of our visitors are from the Portland area.

43% of our visitors come from states other than WA & OR, Canada and other international origins.

Reach, distribution and demographics of print advertising:

Official Seattle Visitors Guide has a distribution of 175,000 and a readership of 770,000. It is placed in over 80 King Co. hotels and visitor centers throughout King Co. (including WA State Convention Center and Pike Place Market). It is placed in corporate housing for Boeing, Amazon, Starbucks, Nordstrom, Microsoft, and Nintendo. And it is placed in all WA State Convention Center attendee packets and inserted in Aug. edition of Portland Monthly.

Seattle Met magazine has a total monthly readership of over 280,000, median age of readership is 42, and average household income is \$191,000. 67% of readers will take 4+ trips in the next year.

Portland Monthly has an even higher monthly readership of over 394,000. The median age of readers is 43 and they have an average household income of \$164,000.

Bridal publications are the preeminent bridal guides for their respective locations.

Loyalty Day Weekend, May 4th – 5th, was full of events. I attended the dedication for Veteran's Field on the 4th. On the same date Ilwaco held its annual Children's Parade. The department provided 4 officers for the parade and a flagger (thanks to Councilman Linhart). On the 5th Long Beach held its annual parade. The department fielded 4 officers for the parade and 5 flaggers. The weather was beautiful and the crowds for all the events were large and as always well behaved.

I received a letter and certificate on the 9th from the Washington State Criminal Justice Training Commission verifying that the department had met its mandatory 24 hours of training per officer for 2012. In 2012 each officer received approx. 46 hours of training each. A copy of the certificate is attached.

On the 9th I received a thank you letter from the Long Beach Elks for Loretta. Loretta had participated with the Elks at a "youth table" at the Well Spring Town Hall event in April. A copy of the letter is attached.

Officer Jeff Cutting attended training May 13th – 17th. The course title was "Pressure Point Control Tactics Instructor Course". The course taught the most common types of resistance that officer's encounter and the best control techniques to deal with the resistance. It also dealt with the legal aspects of use of force and clarified the appropriate level of force for every level of resistance. By taking the instructor course Jeff will be able to train other officers in the department.

Officer Randy Busby worked his last day for the Long Beach Police Department on May 19th. Randy worked here for over 7 years. He has accepted a position with a police department in Arizona. The department held a going away dinner for Randy and his family earlier in May and we all wish Randy the best.


Officer Tim Mortenson attended training May 21st – 23rd. The course was a "street crimes seminar" that dealt with such topics as deadly force incidents, hostage negotiating, dealing with ambushes, interrogation tactics and many other subjects.

I assisted Child Protective Services on the 24th with interviewing candidates for a job opening they have for a case worker.

Memorial Day Weekend, May 24th – 27th was busy. The department dealt with numerous fight and disturbance calls. Hopefully this is not a preview of what to expect in the summer.

On Memorial Day, May 27th, I attended the Memorial Day Services at the Ilwaco Cemetery, Ilwaco Black Lake Monument and at Veterans Field in Long Beach. The weather was terrible but I was glad to see that there was still good sized attendance at the events. The department provided traffic control at the Black Lake Monument for that ceremony. I was glad to attend these events and take a moment to remember the over 1,318,000 men and women who have given their lives while serving during our various wars and conflicts.

On May 31st and June 1st the department held civil service testing for the purposes of establishing a hiring list.




On June 10, 2013, the Hearings Examiner for the City of Long Beach, Washington did issue a report of decision for the following application:
