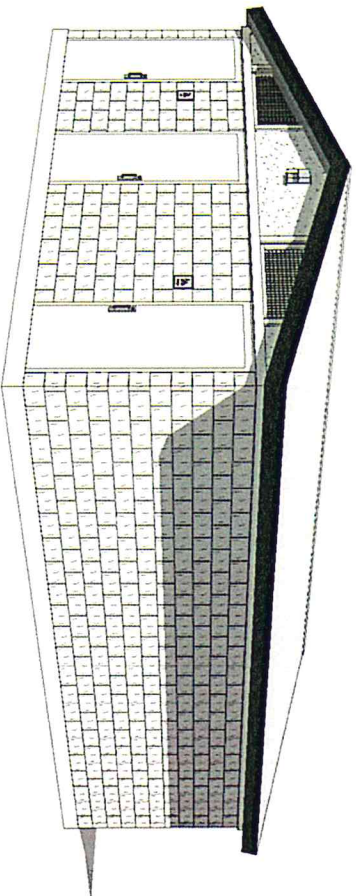

RE: Beach Shelter Project

The City of Long Beach hosts thousands of visitors each year. The main draws for Long Beach are the beach, Discovery Trail and the Long Beach Boardwalk. One of the things Long Beach offers that other towns don't are wood beach shelters which give more access to the beach on the windy days. They have a square deck with triangular walls on the windy side to provide protection and a more enjoyable time. Each shelter has a bench, picnic table and BBQ. The City has four of these on the beach, mostly near the Bolstad approach. As more development has occurred near the Sid Snyder Drive approach, we have found we have a need for an additional four shelters. Due to the increased amount of foot traffic near the Sid Snyder approach, these additional shelters will keep people on the beach longer, giving them a safe and comfortable place to enjoy the natural beauty of the Peninsula.

The estimated cost for materials only to build a new shelter is just under \$8,000. We estimate that it would take about 160 hours to for the city crew to build each one at roughly \$6,000 in labor. The grand total for each would be just under \$14,000. The shelters are moved up to parking area near the beach approach in the winter months to preserve the structures. The city crew continually maintains them as well.

The last one was built in 2011 and has held up very well.

RE: Sound System

The City of Long Beach is the keeper of infrastructure for most of the events that are held in the city. We have everything from traffic cones and temporary fencing to backhoes and beach cleaners. Occasionally, the bigger ticket items need replacing, and some of those same items are used by our utility departments. In rare instances, there are some items that are specifically tourist related. One of these items is the sound system we use for all our outdoor events. Roughly every 8 years, the city needs to replace the sound system. This is typically a system with over 800 watts of power that plays music or voice through 8 speakers. The city will need to replace our sound system by 2020, mostly due to the harsh environment in which it operates. The city performs annual maintenance on the system, but fine sand always gets deep into the electronic components.

The city's lodging tax budget is tasked with expenses related to marketing and festivals. The fund continues to grow both in revenue and expenses. The city has a contract with the Pacific County Tourism Bureau, and 34% of what the city receives is spent with them for marketing. The remaining 66% pays for everything tourism related, such as labor to clean restrooms and Boardwalk repair and maintenance. During the tenure of Mayor Phillips, we have been reviewing and reassessing the expenditures for lodging tax funds with the intent to prioritize expenditures based on potential return. As the primary funding for the repair of the Long Beach Boardwalk, the priority changed to save more for the expected \$700,000 rebuild of the Boardwalk and fund less expenditures related to festivals and equipment. This has left festivals and other equipment needs feeling the pinch as we continue to support expenditures for the marketing of the Peninsula.

The city has received a quote from our usual equipment supplier, Rose City Sound, for a replacement. The cost is similar to previous sound system purchases at \$16,462.78. This system is used for events that potentially bring more than 250,000 people to the Peninsula and would be hard to live without. Please consider funding the replacement of the sound system.
